Dr. Melissa Reeves, Ph.D., NCSP, LPC is the past-president of the National Association of School Psychologists, former Chair of the NASP National School Safety and Crisis Response Committee, a nationally certified school psychologist, licensed professional counselor and special education teacher, and former district coordinator of social/emotional/behavioral services. Currently, she is a Senior Threat Manager with SIGMA/ONTIC Threat Management Associates and threat assessment & mental health specialist with Safe & Dound Schools. She has won numerous awards, conducted 250+ workshops and presentations, and is a co-author to the PREPaRE School Safety and Crisis Preparedness Curriculum, and numerous books and publications.



Dennis J. Simon, Ph.D.

Dr. Dennis Simon is a licensed clinical and school psychologist with over 3 decades of experience supervising interns, professionals, and psychological services. For 14 years, he was Director of NSSEO Timber Ridge Therapeutic Day School, a zero-reject public school program serving the Chicago area. His career has centered on program development and psychological interventions for children and adolescents experiencing social, emotional, and behavioral disorders. He has written extensively about the adaptation of evidence-based strategies to school- centered interventions and about best-practice supervision for school psychology. He has been a Lecturer in School Psychology, Clinical Psychology, and Teacher Education Programs at Loyola University of Chicago.

For nearly two decades, Dr. Anastasia K. Skalski was the Director of Professional Policy and Practice and the Director of Public Policy for the National Association of School Psychologists (Bethesda, MD). In these roles she worked to connect research, policy and practice at the local, state, and national levels through advocacy for increasing access to student mental health services and the comprehensive services of the school psychologist. Dr. Skalski has over 35 years of experience working in educational settings and school psychology having also served as a school psychologist for the Douglas County and Cherry Creek Public Schools in CO, as an Assistant Professor in School Psychology and Initial Teacher Certification at the University of Colorado-Denver, and as the Coordinator of Mental Health Services for the Douglas County Schools (CO). Dr. Skalski earned her BA in Psychology from Hanover College (IN) and her MA and PhD in School Psychology from the University of Denver.
